- All fraternities are required to host a social event training program before they are allowed to host registered house parties. During the approximately 1 hour training, 15 minutes is spend discussing best practices for avoiding sexual assault situations and the definition of consent
- Fraternity members with houses on campus – approximately 500 male students

Sep 15 Fall New Member Symposium

- All new members of fraternities and sororities are required to attend a 3 hour educational program during the fall semester. A portion of the program –approximately 30-45 minutes is spent on alcohol and drug education, sexual violence awareness education and prevention and discussion on consent and bystander behavior.
- All new fraternity and sorority members and all chapter and council leaders – approximately 152 students in the Fall.

Nov 30 Safe Dating Seminar

- Sigma Delta Tau Sorority and Zeta Beta Tau Fraternity partnered with their national organizations to present a safe dating seminar for all members of their organizations. The program was 4 hours long and covered everything from sexual awareness, to harassment to assault.

Jan 24 and Jan 25 **Spring New Member Symposium**

- All new members of fraternities and sororities are required to attend a 3 hour educational program during the fall semester.
